**Note:** In general, HHS identifies a child as “waiting to be adopted” if the child has a case plan goal of adoption and/or the rights of his/her parents have been terminated. However, it excludes from the count any child who is 16 years of age or older and whose parents’ parental rights have been terminated if that child has a case plan goal of “emancipation.”
