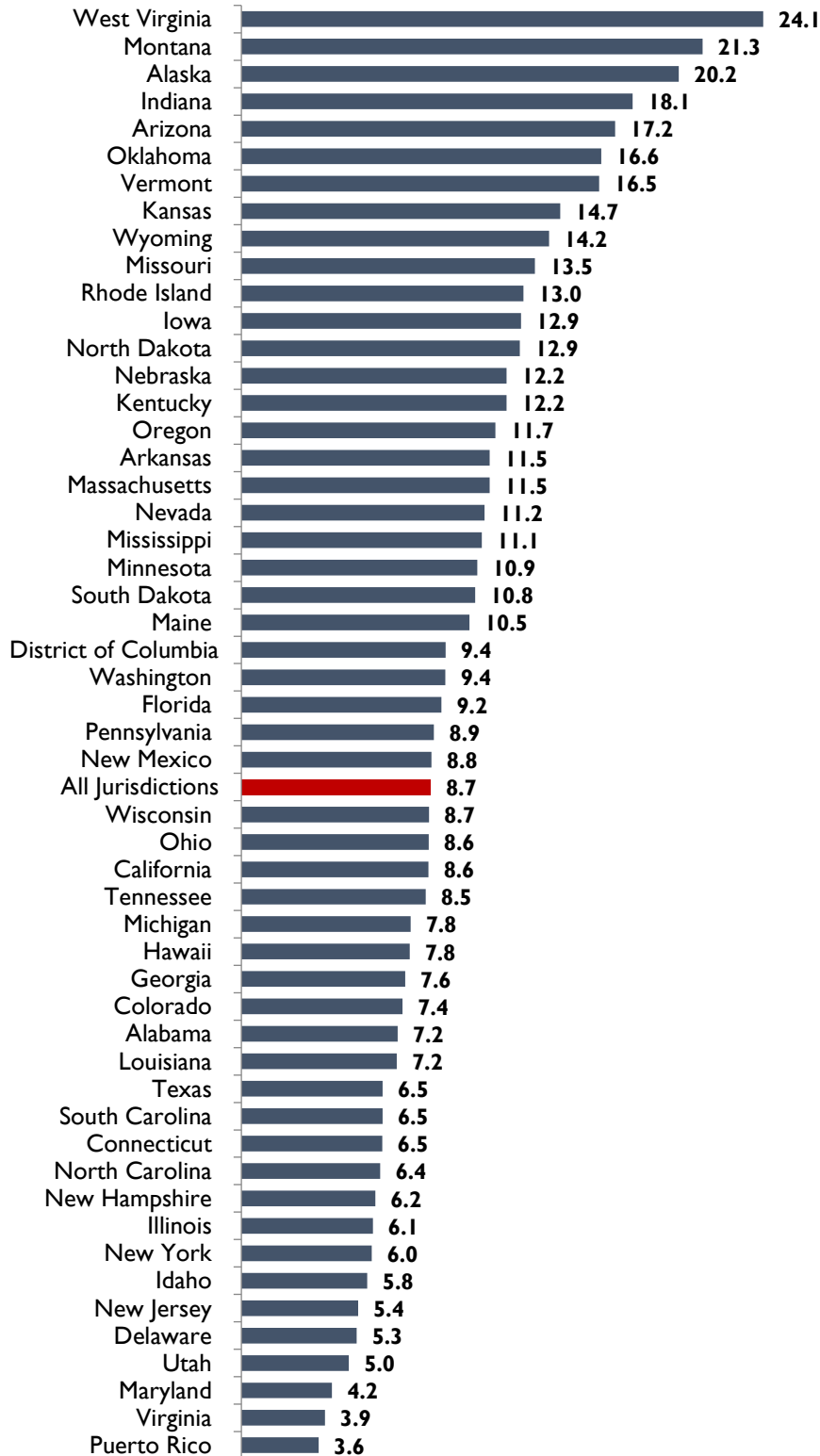


Figure 11-4 Rate of Children Served in Foster Care by State, FY2016

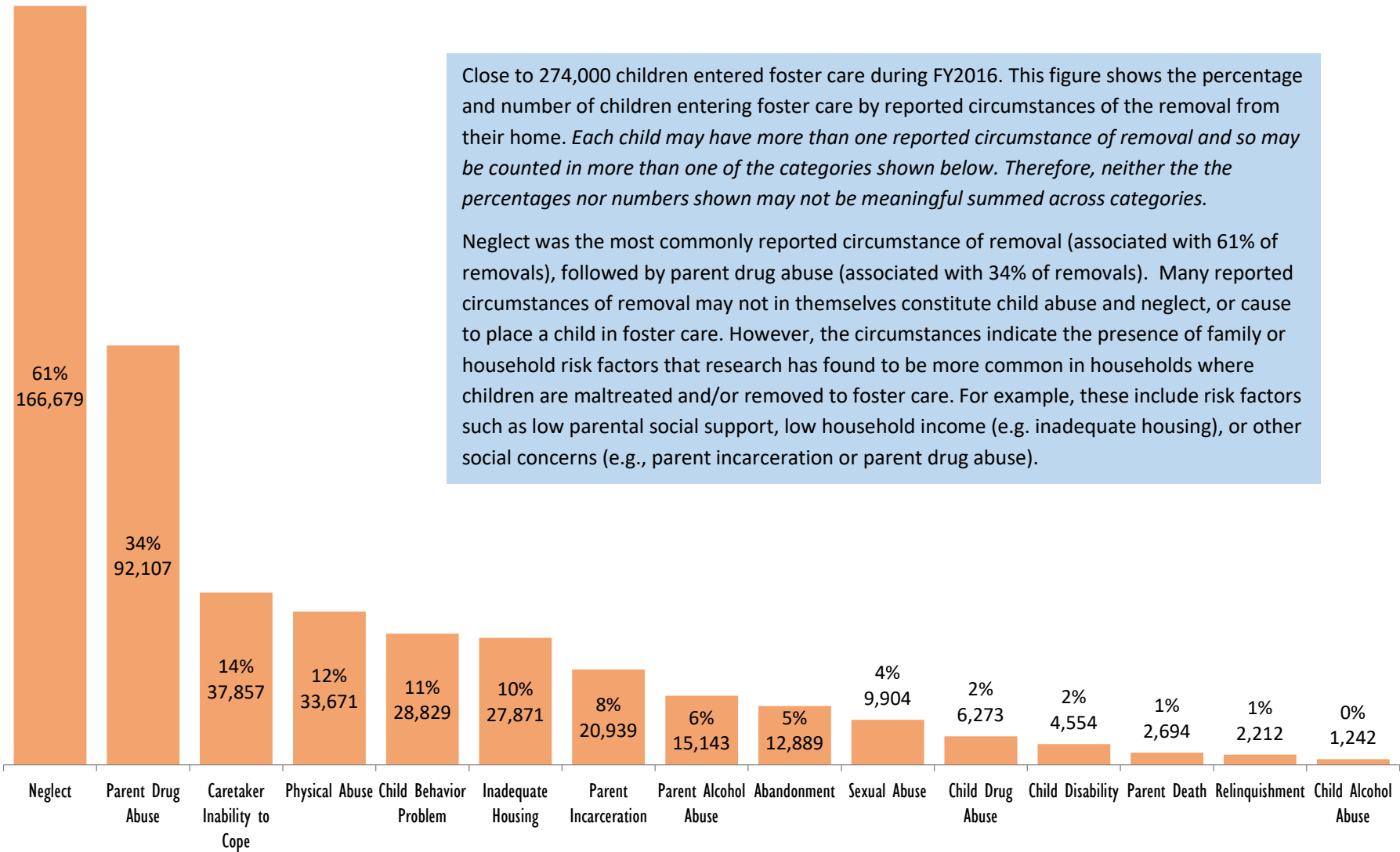
Rate = number of children who spent at least 24 hours in care during FY2016 for every 1,000 children living in the state.

Figure II-4A. Circumstances Associated with Children’s Removal From the Home, FY2016



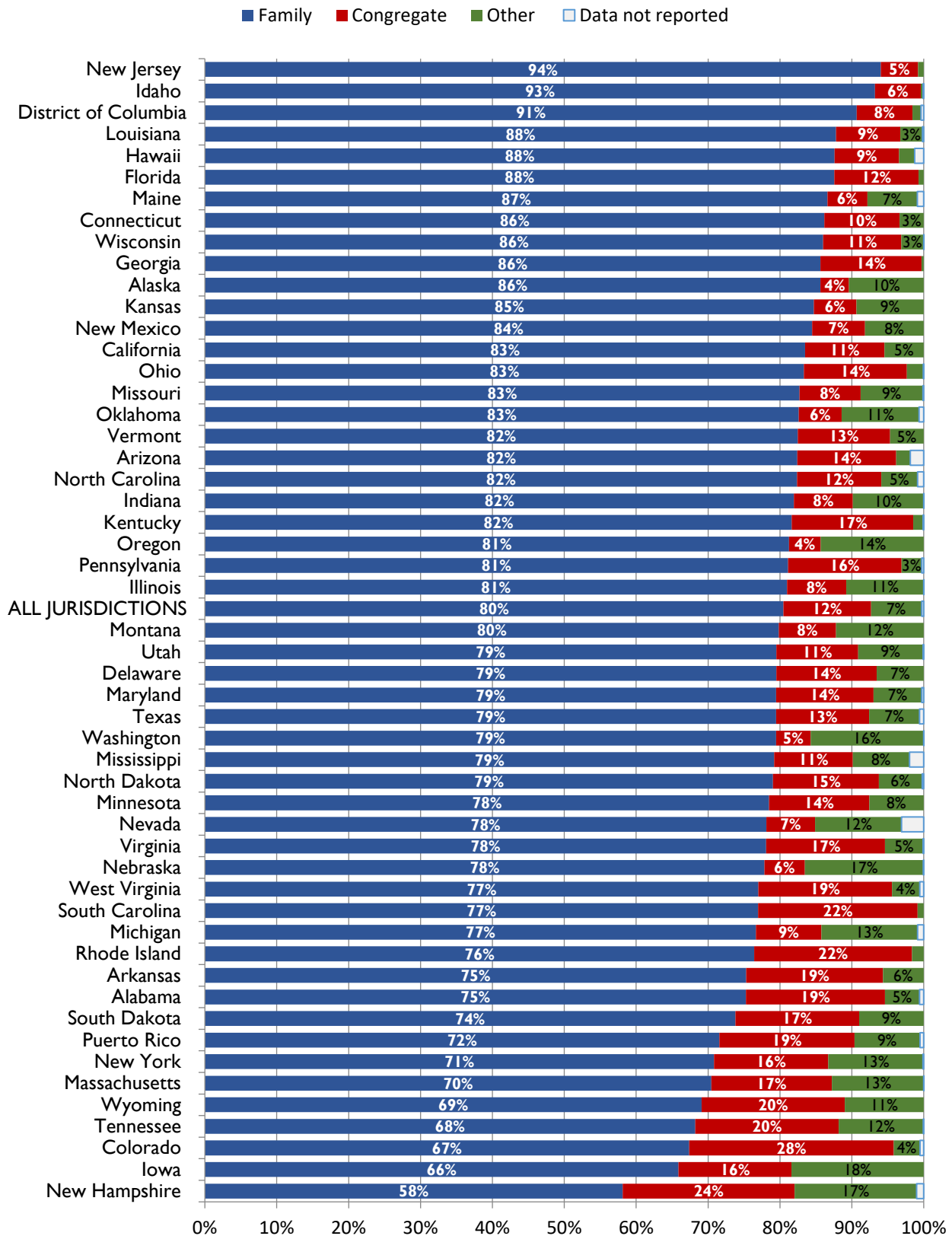
Close to 274,000 children entered foster care during FY2016. This figure shows the percentage and number of children entering foster care by reported circumstances of the removal from their home. *Each child may have more than one reported circumstance of removal and so may be counted in more than one of the categories shown below. Therefore, neither the percentages nor numbers shown may not be meaningful summed across categories.*

Neglect was the most commonly reported circumstance of removal (associated with 61% of removals), followed by parent drug abuse (associated with 34% of removals). Many reported circumstances of removal may not in themselves constitute child abuse and neglect, or cause to place a child in foster care. However, the circumstances indicate the presence of family or household risk factors that research has found to be more common in households where children are maltreated and/or removed to foster care. For example, these include risk factors such as low parental social support, low household income (e.g. inadequate housing), or other social concerns (e.g., parent incarceration or parent drug abuse).
